Tradition Six:

An A.A. group ought never finance or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

Tradition Six also enjoins the group never to go into business nor ever to lend the A.A. name or money credit to any "outside" enterprise, no matter how good. Strongly expressed is the opinion that even clubs should not bear the A.A. name; that they ought to separately incorporated and managed by those individual A.A.s who need or want clubs enough to financially support them. **12X12**
